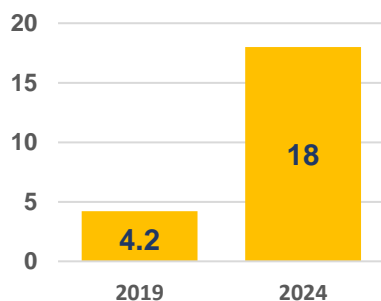

Market Overview



- Total transaction value in the digital payment segment is expected to show an annual growth rate (CAGR 2020-2024) of 10.9% (Statista, 2020).
- Retail shops and gas stations are partnering with e-wallet companies (including The Company) to enable cashless payments (Themalaysianreserve, fintechnews, 2019).
- According to Central Bank of Malaysia there are 47 licensed e-money issuers in Malaysia, but only a handful of them are active.
